Board News

The Board meeting scheduled for February 20, 2012 was canceled. The next Board meeting will be the Annual Meeting on Monday, April, 16, 2012. Full minutes and reports are posted on our website, www.shearwatercondos.com.

Treasurer's Report-Phil Hatchard

A monthly Treasurer's report giving the status of both the operating and reserve accounts relative to budget is posted on the Shearwater web site.

As of February 29, 2012, our operating expenses are within budget. The Reserve Fund balance is reasonable, given the large outlays associated with painting and building maintenance, but is not adequate to complete the remaining deck and storage closet door replacements. You may have received letters explaining the problem and the need for an assessment in order to complete the work. You will also see more information about that in the rest of the newsletter. You, the owners, have the final say in the matter in the form of a vote to be taken at the Annual meeting in April.

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Architecture—Rainette Bannon

Spring arrived early this year – in fact, did we have a winter?? - and with it, requests for window replacements which have been approved by the Architectural Committee in buildings 14 and 3. Our continuing concern is that replacement windows match the current exterior framing and colors at Shearwater. Please contact the Committee if you plan to replace any windows and we can give you any information needed by your dealer regarding type, color and installation. The process to follow was outlined in my last report - the Architectural Committee, Brodie, and the Board of Directors all sign off on any exterior work by residents to Shearwater condominiums.

Given that windows seem the focus of most exterior work by residents, I walked the property a couple of weeks ago on a glorious spring-like afternoon and noted a number of units whose windows have broken seals, creating a fogged appearance. If you are one of the units with clouded windows, please have them replaced. I have used American Glass for a number of replacements and it has been my experience that they stand behind the work they do. In one case, a picture window had to be replaced twice before the seal held and the company made good on the replacements. There have been other companies that replace windows with broken seals; it would be wise to do a current check as some who residents used formerly, are no longer in business.

Please remember as the warm weather arrives to keep your entry passageways clear in the event of an emergency. Mike Yerman, Wendy Tsai and I are the Architectural Committee and are always interested in your comments or questions. As always, we appreciate your cooperation in keeping Shearwater a beautiful, synchronous space for residents and guests.

Landscaping—Ron Faulkner

As you all know, we were fortunate to have a mild winter. The Landscape Committee continued to meet and work on completing projects that were started, but not completed, in the Fall. We have already begun our Spring work, with pruning and mulching either complete or in process, winter weeds being pulled, turf grass being mowed, and grasses being divided and replanted around the property. As soon as planting can be done, we will be renewing the landscape in front of Building 14 and along the waterside of Building 4. Other projects are in the works for completion between now and the fall.

Some of you have asked about the status of planting the replacement tree which is required after removing the large oak tree by Building I. The Landscape Committee is reviewing potential sites for placement of the tree and will be making the recommendation soon.

Don Kadanoff has been working on the complicated task of adding separate water meters for the irrigation system, pool, and marina. Having separate meters for these areas which do not put water into the sewer system would significantly reduce the amount of our water bills. Don will have estimates for installation, as well as a report that will show the savings, for the Board to review prior to the April Board Meeting.
