


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LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Board News

The Board met on November 22, 2010. The next Board meeting will be February 21, 2011. Here are some highlights from the November 2010 meeting. Full minutes and reports are posted on our website, www.shearwatercondos.com.

Treasurer's Report-Phil Hatchard

November 22, 2010—Treasurer's Report for October: We are \$14,556 over budget in the operating fund. The reserve fund expenditures are \$74,652. The reserve balance is \$247,286. The reason for being over budget continues to be building maintenance costs.

Updated Treasurer's Report

<u>December 31, 2010-</u>The detailed Treasurer's report can be viewed every month on our web site. We are financially sound, but expenses are climbing again this year in two categories. The "General Maintenance" category (primarily buildings) of the Operating Budget is well over budget again this year. In addition we find ourselves spending Reserve Account funds on "unplanned" (not identified or included in the reserve account study of March 2010) but necessary maintenance, as well as capital improvements.

We are following the Reserve Account Study recommendations by continuing planned maintenance of Unit Decks and closet doors, and have completed the flat (equipment) roof replacement for all buildings.

We will recommend a budget for fiscal year 2012 in April.

My two-year term serving as Treasurer on the Board of Directors (BOD) ends June 30, 2011. The BOD will be in need of a replacement starting in July, and welcomes volunteers, to be elected at the June business meeting.

Architecture—

November 22, 2010—The Architecture Committee is in need of a Chairperson

Landscaping—

November 22, 2010—The Landscape Committee is in need of a Chairperson.

Marina—Eric Pettersen & Skip Smith

November 22, 2010—Eric and Skip have reviewed records and procedures of marina operations, organized and met with a marina committee, itemized needed dock repairs, and updated records of boats, dinghies, and kayaks for the January billing. The Marina Committee consists of Jim Behrens, Ted Finlayson, Phil Hatchard, and Lois McGovern. Following is a summary of the proposals presented:

- Require that kayaks and dinghies have an identifying sticker attached.
- Increase the guest slip fee from \$20 to \$30.
- Re-institute an annual GCE slip rental contract and collect the same information from LCE slip users (no contract).
- Discontinue the practice of LCE/GCE swaps beginning 2012.

November 22, 2010—

- Deck replacement on townhouse buildings should be completed by the end of the year. 17 decks were replaced this past year and 23/25 are scheduled to be replaced in 2011.
- Gutter cleaning will be scheduled for the first week of December. Three quotes were presented.
- Chimney cleaning for unit owners wanting this service is scheduled for December 17 & 18.
- Signs are being posted on the recycle toters to remind residents to use these toters for recyclable items only.

- All residents are reminded that a link for the Shearwater Condo By-Laws and Rules and Regulations
 are on our website. It's a good idea to review both of these documents from time to time so that
 you do not inadvertently do something that would result in a violation notice and fines. Let's all follow the rules and keep the Shearwater Community a great place to live!
- There have been complaints regarding people putting trash in the recycling toters, as well as putting so much in them that they overflow. The recycling toters are for recyclable cardboard, paper, plastic, cans, plastic and glass bottles only. Absolutely no unrecyclable trash should be placed in these toters. All unrecyclable trash should be placed in the dumpsters. The trash/recycle area has been an eyesore as people are contaminating the toters with trash that cannot be recycled, thus it will not be picked up. As a result, Brodie Management and the Board are considering swapping the recycle toters at the main entrance for a recycle dumpster. Please help out by doing your part by placing trash and recyclables in their proper containers.
- The Association has not been strict on those of you who walk your dogs in common areas other than the area specified for dog walking; however, this might have to change. It has been noticed that not everyone is "picking up" after their dogs. Anywhere you walk your dog, you are responsible for picking up after them, for obvious reasons. Be a responsible dog owner...always pick up the poop!
