Board News

The Board met on February 21, 2011. The next Board meeting will be the Annual Meeting on Monday, April, 18, 2011. Here are some highlights from the February 2011 meeting. Full minutes and reports are posted on our website, www.shearwatercondos.com.

Treasurer's Report-Phil Hatchard

The detailed Treasurer's report can be viewed every month on our web site. We are currently financially sound, but we find ourselves spending approximately \$45,000 of Reserve Account funds on "unplanned" (not identified or included in the Reserve Account study of March 2010) but necessary repair and replacement.

We are following the Reserve Account Study recommendations by continuing planned maintenance of Unit Decks and closet doors, and have completed the flat (equipment) roof replacement for all buildings. This fiscal years deck work is approximately two thirds finished.

We will recommend a budget for fiscal year 2012 in April. Although the Reserve Account balance may seem healthy at \$222,924, we have more work to do than resources available. Maintenance expenses next year will be dominated by the need to paint all Shearwater buildings at an estimated cost of \$125,000 (not included in the recent Reserve Account Financial Study), along with an additional cost for replacement of deteriorated siding. In order to accomplish that work, we may have to prioritize and delay other planned maintenance.

Landscaping—Updated Landscaping Report—March 11, 2010

The Landscaping Committee met on March 10. Depending on funds available in the budget, we have decided to move forward with projects started last year that were not completed; i.e., Phase III of tree work with Davey Tree Service, fertilizing the native dogwood trees, and topping the evergreens behind the pool. We also assessed winter damage, of which there was very little this year. We will remove the dead shrubs behind the entrance sign, and we will replace warranted shrubs that have died in front of Buildings I-2 and the pool building. We will complete the plantings in front of Buildings I-2. The next projects include additional plantings for Buildings I,2, 4 & 5, design a planting plan for Buildings 3 & 6, and initiate implementation of Phase III of the sprinkler system.

Marina—Eric Pettersen & Skip Smith—Updated Marina Report—March 17, 2011—

Spring has arrived, and one sure sign is that the water at the marina will be turned on the first week of April! The process of registering all the boats in the marina has been successful, thanks to the cooperation of all of the users. We will also be supplying "stickers" for the kayak owners to place on their vessels so that we can better identify misplaced or unregistered kayaks in the future. The marina facilities seem to be in good shape for the coming year, but the Dockmasters do have a list of mostly minor maintenance tasks that they have asked Brodie to correct. Please feel free to notify either Eric Petterson (eric.petterson@comcast.net) or Skip Smith (yellowbird7@verizon.net) if you have an issue that needs to be addressed. We hope that everyone has a chance to enjoy the spectacular Chesapeake!


